

# **Guide for the BDMA Insurance Technician Examination**

#### **Examination**

The examination is based entirely on the syllabus published on the BDMA website, <a href="www.bdma.org.uk">www.bdma.org.uk</a>. Any other training courses or material will support your performance in the exam but it is recommended that you study the syllabus as widely as possible.

#### **Examination structure**

The time allowed to complete the examination is 3 hours. The test is made up of a combination of multiple-choice questions (MCQs) and written answers. There are 194 MCQs and 4 questions which need a written answer. The MCQs are worth 1 mark each and there is only one correct answer for each question. **More than one answer per question will be marked as incorrect.** 

The MCQs make up 80% of the available marks and the questions that need a written answer make up 20% of the available marks. The number of marks available for each written answer will be shown on your question paper.

The paper is split into 2 sections. The first section contains the multiple-choice questions and the second section contains the questions requiring a written answer.

The pass mark for the examination is 70%.
