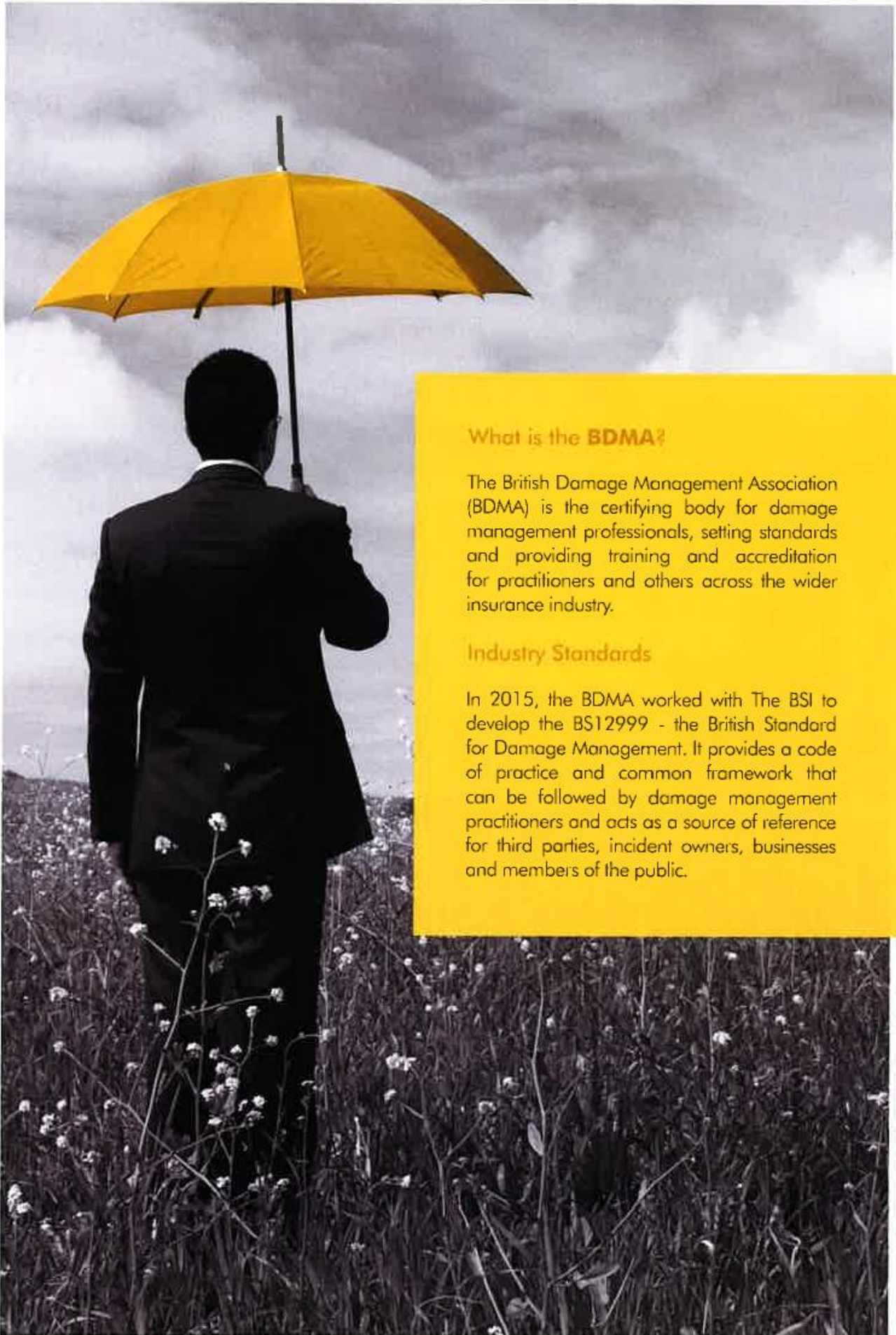

What is the **BDMA**?

The British Damage Management Association (BDMA) is the certifying body for damage management professionals, setting standards and providing training and accreditation for practitioners and others across the wider insurance industry.

Industry Standards

In 2015, the BDMA worked with The BSI to develop the BS12999 - the British Standard for Damage Management. It provides a code of practice and common framework that can be followed by damage management practitioners and acts as a source of reference for third parties, incident owners, businesses and members of the public.

To benefit from the BDMA's support there are the following memberships available:

Associate Membership is available to those with an interest in damage management who do not qualify for accreditation.

Accredited Membership is achieved by examination and is open to any individual who works within damage management, property claims and the wider insurance industry and related sectors.

Corporate Associate Membership status is open to any organisation wishing to show support for the BDMA and the damage management industry.

Corporate Accredited Membership is available to organisations who meet strict criteria and have a specific percentage of staff who are Accredited Individual Members.
